# Workplace safety should not be compromised



Learn the signs of drug use and detection times

Listed below are common drugs of abuse, typical symptoms of their use, and detection times by urine, saliva, and hair testing methods. This information may help you recognize potential behaviors exhibited with drug abuse.





#### Marijuana

**Symptoms:** Altered perception, impaired coordination, dry mouth, bloodshot eyes, increased appetite, euphoria



#### Methadone

**Symptoms:** Slow breathing, sweating, drowsiness, weakness, constricted pupils, nausea, vomiting



# Opiates

**Symptoms:** Insensitivity to pain, euphoria, sedation, nausea, vomiting, mood swings, irritability, anxiety

11-nor-delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol-9-carboxylic acid: **Urine:** 1-3 days, occasional use; up to 30 days, habitual use **Hair:** Up to 90 days, depending on hair length

Delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol: **Urine:** 24-48 hours

#### Phencyclidine (PCP)

**Symptoms:** Increased pulse, heart rate, blood pressure, and temperature, mood-altering effects, paranoia, anxiety, nausea, tremors, suicidal urge Urine: 1-5 days, occasional use; up to 30 days, habitual use Hair: Up to 90 days, depending on hair length Saliva: 24-36 hours



#### Propoxyphene

**Symptoms:** Dizziness, drowsiness, headache, euphoria, decreased balance and coordination, confusion, appetite loss

Urine: 1-3 days



# Rohypnol (Roofies)

**Symptoms:** Sedative effects including amnesia, muscle relaxation, and slowing of psychomotor performance

Urine: 1-3 days
